18th Sunday of Ordinary Time

“Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one’s life does not consist of possessions.” Luke 12:15

Rather than focusing on “things,” Jesus challenges us to live gratefully and generously and to become more “other-centered” than “self-centered.”
